Amazing Animals





WEEKLY PROGRAMS

<u>Week Six - July 23rd - 27th</u> *Things You Can Build*

<u>Week Seven - July 30th -</u> <u>August 3rd</u> Adventure Week



Children will spend each day going on a new adventure without even having to leave the school. Some of the exciting adventures will including camping day, backyard picnic day and beach day.

<u>Week Eight - August 6th - 10th</u> Wonders of Science
